# Welcome to 2015!

The beginning of a new year means new resolution, new opportunity, and usually new challenges. For Grace Evangelical Church, 2015 promises to be one filled with all of the above.

For the past year the church leadership has been grappling with how to make way for another generation to find ministry at Grace, while also seeking to preserve the ministry that we've had for the past 30 years. In seeking to address all of the issues surrounding the topic, we've determined to establish some new additions to our regular Sunday morning line up.

Beginning March 8, (the week after our annual Missions Conference) we'll adjust our service times to 8:00am (from 8:15) and to 11:00am (from 10:45). These 15-minute shifts will allow us to create a new service time at 9:30am, in order to move the service that has met in the old chapel into our current sanctuary. As a result, we will preserve the worship style of our two blended services while making room for our more contemporary service by relocating it to the sanctuary.

In addition to these changes in service times, we'll be adding an additional Sunday School hour and mov-

ing the time of the current Sunday School hour up by 20 minutes. This will create a new time slot for a younger generation to begin instructing their peers, and thus, continue our tradition of Biblical instruction for the next generation. The new Sunday School hours will be from 9:40-10:40am and 10:55-11:55am.

This change in infrastructure alone will not allow us to minister fully without making some adjustments in our ministerial staff. Pastor Nick Pierce began serving as our full time Youth Pastor in November, and beginning in January, Pastor David Ernst will join the pastoral staff as Senior Ministries Pastor.

Additional staff realignment will begin in January following the retirement of our long-time Facility Director, Denny Schneider. His contribution to Grace has been profound, and we thank the Lord that there are gualified individuals ready to step in and continue in Denny's footsteps. Dyann Duncan will take on the fulltime role of Facility Director and move into a part-time student ministry assistant position under the direction of Pastor Nick. In addition, Gary Reynolds will move into a new full-time Maintenance Director position overseeing all Grace property. We're also adding a couple of college students in part-time ministry assistant roles. Josh Smith will be a Media ministry assistant working under the direction of Media Director Jeremy Sharp, and Sean Killen will be a College ministry assistant working under the direction of Pastor Ken Maxey.

All in all, this promises to be a year of new challenges, but new exciting opportunity as well. My prayer is that 2015 will be a year in which you experience God's presence, favor, and blessing.

We are very excited to be the host church for a 15-week session of PER-SPECTIVES in 2015. PERSPECTIVES is a ministry of the U.S. Center for World Mission, a non-denominational ministry serving churches and mission agencies worldwide, offering "Perspectives on the World Christian Movement." PERSPECTIVES will help you experience God's heart for all peoples and encounter the momentum of the World Christian Movement. It will open the eyes of your heart with fresh knowledge and understanding of God's unchanging purposes and why they are relevant to your life. We encourage members and attendees of Grace Evangelical to consider enrolling in these classes and get threaded into the biggest story of all time. There are four different enrollment levels offered: Key reading (audit) only; Certificate; Three semester hours of undergraduate credit; Three semester hours of graduate credit.

**PERSPECTIVES classes will be held at Grace on Tuesday evenings beginning January 13, 2015, and will meet weekly for 15 weeks.** We plan to begin enrollment in November. The cost for the class is \$250, but the church is underwriting \$100 of that for those who regularly attend Grace. There are discounts available for early registration and added family members as well. The Missions Committee is also establishing a \$100 grant for any Grace member/attendee who participates in a short-term missions trip after completing PERSPECTIVES on a Certificate or credit level.

## January 18,2015

# **Identity in Christ**

## High Five Ministry Update

With the new changes being implemented regarding service times for March 2015 we felt it would be good to recap the transformation taking place in High Five Ministries. In order to further assist in this transition process, we will hold one more set of formal meetings for parents and volunteers during the month of January. These meetings have been informational in nature and designed to help solidify our efforts in ministering to students together.

The goal of High Five is to reach the lost and build the saved through 5 basic biblical principles:

God is the Savior for the world.

#### - John 3:16-17

God is our personal Savior and friend.

- Matthew 22:37

#### We are all special in God's eyes.

#### - Matthew 22:39

God and his word help us to make the right choices in life. - Exodus 20:1-17 We need to share God's Love with everyone. - Matthew 28:19-20

We want students to know that God created them, loves them, and has a plan/purpose for their lives. Our desire is for all students that graduate out of High Five ministry programming to have developed strong foundational roots in Christ and have found their identity in Him.

Beginning in March 2015, High Five Ministries will be offering a new branch of ministry specifically designed

for 5th Grade students called the "Crosswalk." In September 2015, this service provision will extend to  $6^{th}$  graders.

The **CROSSWALK**, operated under High Five Ministries, will be one more avenue for providing students a unique opportunity to deepen their walk in Christ.

At this stage in life, students are learning more abstractly. Our purpose and calling in life demands choices, our free will yielded to Christ as Savior and Lord <u>or</u> to our own ambitions. The Crosswalk will be a place for students to:
