Matthew 17:14-21

As our world continues to give evidence of the evil that is in it, I'm feeling compelled to encourage us as a congregation to make a more focused effort at bringing our concerns to Father God.

As a congregation, we have a long standing tradition of making the first Thursday of each month a day to fast and pray for the ministry of the church; I'm proposing that beginning the first Thursday of March (March 5) and continuing each first Thursday thereafter, that we initiate a more corporate nature to our prayer and fasting. With that as our goal, we will begin hosting 6, 1-hour prayer meetings at the church (in the library). These will be scattered throughout the day in order to work into more schedules and incorporate more participants.

The first prayer meeting will begin at 6:00am. It will open with a few minutes of worship, and we will pray. As the 7:00 hour approaches, we'll close the hour in prayer, and at 7:00 begin the second prayer meeting with the same format as the first one., closing at 8:00am This will provide a break to allow some to

leave, and others to enter, yet keep the continuity of worship and prayer. We'll do the same thing from 11:00am to 12:00pm, 12:00pm to 1:00pm, and then from 6:00pm to 7:00pm, concluding with a final prayer meeting from 7:00pm to 8:00pm. These monthly meetings will allow our congregation to keep our current issues before the Lord in prayer.

In addition to a monthly day of prayer and fasting, I'm proposing we initiate a sequence of prayer and fasting days for families. Perhaps each family would set aside a day to pray for each child, as well as the parents. There would be no set format, as each head-of-household would have authority to determine what their prayer and fasting would look like. As always, the Pastoral staff would be happy to suggest options with any person who desires a conversation on the topic. Just call the office and ask to speak with any of the available pastors. My only suggestion would be that each family during the first week of March, and again the first week of September, schedule these specific family prayer and fasting days... in order that we as a church family might be pursuing God together.

Years ago, I ran across a wonderful little booklet by Bill Bright titled, Seven Basic Steps to Successful Fasting and Prayer. It is available free of charge, online, at http://www.cru.org/train-and-grow/devotional-life/7-steps-to-fasting.html

Our prayer is that God will move mightily in our world and in our church, as we seek Him more intentionally in the coming months.

NEW SERVICE TIMES BEGIN MARCH 8TH

Beginning March 8, we are adjusting our service times to 8:00am (from 8:15) and to 11:00am (from 10:45). These 15-minute shifts will allow us to create a new service time at **9:30am.** in order to move the service that has met in the old chapel into our current sanctuary. As a result, we will preserve the worship style of our two blended services while making room for our more contemporary service by relocating it to the sanctuary.

In addition to these changes in service times, we'll be adding an additional Sunday School hour and moving the time of the current Sunday School hour up by 20 minutes. This will create a new time slot for a younger generation to begin instructing their peers, and thus, continue our tradition of Biblical instruction for the next generation. The new Sunday School hours will be from 9:40-10:40am and 10:55-11:55am.

Sunday Evenings

With the new service changes, we are moving to a different format for Sunday evenings. Instead of a regular worship service in the sanctuary, we will be having smaller group studies led by various teachers throughout the year. From time to time, we will schedule a special event or service on a Sunday evenina.

Anyone is welcome to join the Sunday Night Bible Studies, but please be aware that there will be no Children's Church offered on Sunday evenings. We will have the nursery open for children 3 years and under.

The first Sunday Night Bible Study session will begin at 6:00pm on Sunday, March 8, and will be led by Pastor Dave Ernst. It will meet in the Library so Entrance C will be open. Pastor Dave will be teaching from the book of *Ecclesiastes*.

Psalm 25:9-12

"The humble He guides in justice, and the humble He teaches His way. All the paths of the LORD are mercy and truth, To such as keep His covenant and His testimonies. For Your name's sake, O LORD, Pardon my iniquity, for it is great. Who is the man that fears the LORD? Him shall He teach in the way He chooses."

This past week, I read the following in my devotion related to the scripture text noted above:

"The one ingredient that every soul-satisfying life has in common is this: the fear of the Lord. In other words, an awesome and imminent view of God will lead to a joyful and fulfilling kind of life. Our first question, before making any decision, must be "what would be most pleasing and glorifying to God?" And-here is the marvelous revelation from David-whatever is most pleasing and glorifying to God will also bring the most satisfaction and joy to us!

We therefore could not have a more pleasing or inspiring incentive for godly living than this two-pronged promise: God has woven this entire world together, David tells us, in such a way that what is most glorifying to Him will always also be what is most satisfying for us."

I have seen this played out so many times and heard it from so many people. That when they serve God and seek His purpose they are the most fulfilled. How important it is for children to grasp this at an early age. So in their life long journey, with a humble heart, God may guide them and teach His way; Leading them in 12

the paths of mercy and truth.

Thank you for your faithful support over this past year. 2014 was a growing year for Serve India Ministries. We saw the ministry expand greatly in India with the number of pastors being trained and the number of children being discipled. We were only able to grow our budget by 5%, but we were able to double our impact on the mission field. It is amazing to see what God has done.

Jonathan & Khan Zingkhai City Team—San Francisco, California

In January I went on a mission trip to India. I spoke at a conference with over 1,800 students in attendance. Three friends traveled with me. We ministered to people with HIV/AIDS and orphans who lost their parents to AIDS. We visited the Naga School in my village. Our three day Disciple Making Movement training was awesome and fruitful. We will have our 26th graduation ceremony on March 21st at City Team where 9 men will be graduating from a yearlong recovery program.

Bill & Marie Eddy Grace Covenant—Madrid Spain

We had a wonderful week in Dakar. First 5 days participating as speakers at the West Africa Retreat for Missionaries from Brazil. Over 50 people from all denominations but with one purpose- spread the gospel in West Africa. Marie and I spoke on how to care for the TCK (Third Culture Kid) from birth through the teen years. Then on the week end we did a mini camp with the 20 adolescent TCK's. Another of the touching times was when about half of them made a public decision to forgive their parents for hurts they had received from their missionary life style. Since Mom and Dad are the ones to decide to move... Mom and Dad usually are seen as causing the pain.

Brandon & Kelli Bodenhausen In Faith —Bolivar, Missouri

We started taking the Bolivar Middle School students to a new project house. Every other Friday they'll participate at the Project House and all the other Fridays we'll continue going into the school. At the end of the year we conducted a year end interview with one of our students. The board of directors beautifully shared the gospel with him. We are having an open house this Saturday at the project house Project 310 has been allowed to participate in. Anyone who has had a hand in repairing it gets to see the finished product. Thanks to the generosity and patience of one of our board members, we are able to "piggy back" with whatever project he is working on at the time.

Guido & Kimberly Orrellana One Mission Society—Ecuador

We believe that God is leading us to plant a church in Pallatanga and have begun the process with a weekly Bible study in town. We have also been meeting with a fellow church planter in Quito for mentoring in the planting process. Our weekends are mostly full with hosting camps and retreats until mid-May. These are retreats the local churches program and we provide lodging and meals. Kim continues to work on her Master's Program and Guido is studying to finish his seminary degree.
